We are pleased to have good Samaritans like MaxProf bao ba tsebago leshoko by being able to handover this shoes to you. For this reason, I can proudly say we making an impact in your lives.

We are aware that what MaxProf is doing based on our historical background is a drop in the ocean because she cannot reach everybody, however, we trust that she have made changes in the lives of those who are going to reach more, especially the most needy.

We do not want you to attend school with torn, old clothing and make it difficult for you to feel confident both socially and academically amongst your peers. We want to unfold your full potential in order to ensure that nothing hold you back from achieving your dreams.

As we handover this shoes, we wish to encourage parents to take part in education of their children and work very closely with educators in moulding our future leaders to become better citizen demanding by modern society.

To all beneficiaries, we humble ourselves as we handover these shoes and enable you to reclaim our future as we change the face of our community. Allow me to thank MaxProf for making sure that this event becomes a successes and I wish to urge them to continue supporting poor and rural communities.

Walking barefoot to school should stay in the past and never come back. Today we are here to give away pairs of school shoes to some of you who are not lucky enough to afford such. Put your feet in and walk tall. Concentrate on your education and do your best. One renowned author once said "a journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step."

Let me end by appealing to our parents that when we want to raise issues of with government we should do so by making use of the channels and platforms

that are available to us, ranging from public participation programmes to engage with provincial and municipal leadership. We should however not compromise the interest of children and use it to bargain for community issues.

We call upon all communities to safeguard the rights of our children who are the leaders of tomorrow and not allow any person to reverse, and undermine our historical achievements. Everyone, including the non-governmental organisations should play their part to ensure that our children are not prevented from going to schools.
