UPGRADING OF PHALAKWANE VILLAGE 3,5 KM INTERNAL ROAD FROM GRAVEL TO TAR, KERBS AND STORMWATER CONTROL - WARD 23

Residents of Lepelle-Nkumpi Local Municipality (LNM) continue to benefit from quality infrastructure, as the development of infrastructure enhances mobility, safety, and service delivery.

The upgrading of 3.5 km internal road, kerbs and storm water control in Phalakwane Village, Ga-Mphahlele cluster, Ward 23, is progressing well, and currently 63% completion. A total of 26 local workers, of which 12 are young people and 01 disabled persons, have been recruited, helping to boost local employment.

The project details are as follows: contract value of the multi-year project is R33 million, with a start date of 04 December 2024, and a planned completion date of 04 December 2025, which is a duration of twelve (12) months.

The scope of work includes upgrading the road from gravel to tar, installation of adequate drainage infrastructure, road markings, and signage. Upon completion, the upgraded road will connect to the R37 Road and link the villages of Phalakwane, Maake, Patoga and Seleteng (Mphahlele Tribal Offices).

This project represents a significant investment in the infrastructure and well-being of Phalakwane Village. Furthermore, an upgrade of this crucial internal road will benefit the community in terms of safety, accessibility, and overall quality of life.
