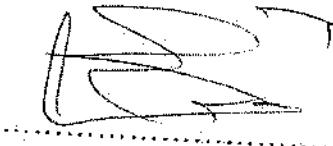

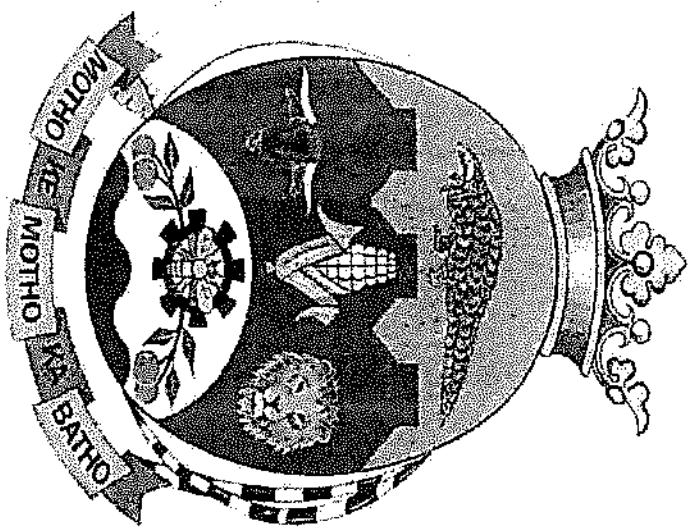

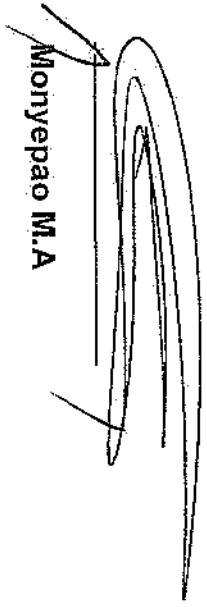
Municipal Manager's Foreword

The Municipal Finance Management Act of 2003 requires that municipalities prepare a Service Delivery and Budget Implementation Plan as an implementation and management tool to ensure that budgetary decisions that are adopted by the municipalities for the financial year are aligned with their Integrated Development Plan. Section 72 of the MFMA compels the Accounting Officer of a municipality to submit a Mid-Year Budget and Performance Assessment Report by 25 January of each year to the Mayor, National Treasury and the Provincial Treasury.

The Council should reserve its oversight role over the performance at the end of the financial year when the Annual Report of the municipality is tabled. It is however, important that the in-year reporting should serve as an early warning indicator for poor performance and to give both the council and administration the opportunity to take corrective measures in those areas where poor performance is reported.

For the financial year 2023/24 Lepelle-Nkumpi local municipality set itself targets which seek to ensure the realization of the broader vision and mission of the municipality. In relation to this, various objectives were identified with specific performance indicators and the targets clustered together in relation to the Outcome 9 of the National Strategic Agenda highly aiming at achieving a "Responsive, accountable, effective and efficient local government system".

MUNICIPAL OVERVIEW

Lepelle-Nkumpi is one of the four local municipalities within the Capricorn District Municipality in Limpopo Province and is located in the southern part of the Capricorn District. The municipality is predominantly rural with a population of approximately 233925 people. It covers 3,464.00 hectares, which represents 16% of the District's total land area and is divided into 30 wards which comprise a total of 94 settlements. About 95% of its land falls under the jurisdiction of Traditional Authorities.

MFMA LEGISLATIVE REQUIREMENTS AND GUIDELINES

According to section 53 (1) (c) (ii) of the MFMA, the mayor is expected to approve the SDBIP within 28 days after the approval of the budget. This section requires him or her to take all reasonable steps to ensure that the SDBIP is approved within 28 days. In addition, the mayor must ensure that the revenue and expenditure projections for each month and the service delivery targets and performance indicators as set out in the SDBIP are circulated or made public within 14 days after its approval.

TOP LAYER SDBIP AND INDICATORS

The SDBIP is required to include targets for the activities that will be undertaken, for physical and measurable progress as well as financially. The SDBIP includes measurable performance objectives in the form of the service delivery targets and performance indicators that are provided to the community, that is, what impacts it seeks to achieve. These are drawn from the IDP programmes, services and activities that are relevant to each specific directorate as well as the statutory plans that the directorates are responsible for. The SDBIP is the key mechanism for monitoring the different responsibilities and targets that each directorate must fulfil in meeting service delivery needs provided to the community.

LINKING THE IDP AND THE BUDGET

The SDBIP is conceptualized or defined as a layered plan, with consolidated service targets and quarterly to annual deadlines and linking those targets to senior management. The community and stakeholders can review these targets and performance during the IDP processes.

Integrated Development Plan requires many different planning processes in order to be brought together. In terms of linking service delivery and budget implementation plans of the directorates in the municipality with the other planning processes in the IDP, the directorates routinely produce operational plans, capital plans, annual budgets, institutional and HR plans, to take the IDP forward. The budget is allocated against the different directorates within the municipality as contained in the IDP of the municipality.

REPORTING ON THE SDBIP

Executive Managers report to the Municipal Manager on a monthly and quarterly basis. The reports must reflect whether key performance indicators and performance targets of the service delivery and budget implementation plans are achieved. The reasons for under performance, deviations and other challenges must be clearly spelt out, as well as measures to address under performance.

Copies of these reports are made available to the internal audit which make comments and report to the municipal manager. These reports are tabled at a management meeting before they are tabled at various political committees established to assist the Mayor. Council discuss these reports and make recommendations to the mayor, who in turn together with the EXCO assess progress made and periodic interventions needed to keep the municipality on track. The audit committee receives reports from the internal audit division through the municipal manager and makes recommendations to council quarterly.

Council receives performance reports from the Mayor, accompanied by the audit committee report at the end of every quarter. Council report to the community through mechanisms determined by it through its community participation and communication policy. Council also report annually to the office of the Auditor-General, the MEC responsible for local government in the province, National and Provincial treasury.

QUARTERLY REPORTING

Section 52 (d) OF THE MFMA compels the Mayor to submit a report to the council on the implementation of the budget and financial state of the municipality within 30 days of the end of each quarter. The quarterly performance projections captured in the SDBIP form the basis for the Mayor's quarterly report.

MID-YEAR REPORTING

Section 72 (1) (a) of the MFMA outlines the requirements for mid-year reporting. The accounting officer is required by the 25th January of each year to assess the performance of the municipality during the first half of the year.

ANNUAL REPORTING

The Mayor must within seven months after the end of the financial year, table in the municipal council the annual report of the municipality a required by section 127 (2) of the Municipal Finance Management Act 56 of 2003.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE REPUBLIC OF SOUTH AFRICA: 1996

Section 152 of the Constitution mandates local government, among others, to:

- Provides democratic and accountable government for local communities

- Encourage the involvement of communities and community organizations in the matters of local government.

THE WHITE PAPER ON LOCAL GOVERNMENT 1998

The White Paper on Local Government (1998) puts forward for the new developmental Local Government system and identifies tools for realising a developmental local government through:

- Integrated Development planning and budgeting;
- Performance management; and
- Working together with local citizens and partners.

MUNICIPAL SYSTEMS ACT NO. 32 OF 2000

The Municipal Systems Act no 32 of 2000, Chapter 6 enforces the idea of local government PMS.

MUNICIPAL PLANNING AND PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS OF 2001

The Municipal Planning and Performance Regulations (2001) set out in detail requirements for municipal PMS. It entails a framework that describes and represent how the municipal cycle and processes of performance planning, monitoring, measurement, review, reporting and improvement will be conducted, organised and managed including the determining of the roles and responsibilities of different role players.

MUNICIPAL PERFORMANCE MANAGEMENT REGULATIONS OF 2006

The Local Government Municipal Performance Regulations for municipal managers and managers directly accountable to municipal managers sets out how the performance of Section 57 staff will be uniformly directed, monitored and improved. The regulations address both the employment contract and performance agreement of municipal managers and managers directly accountable to municipal managers. It further provides a methodology for the performance management system as well as criteria for performance bonus payments.

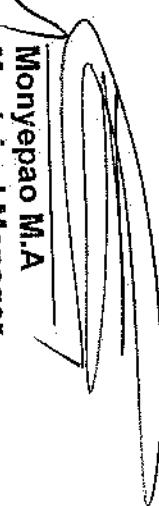

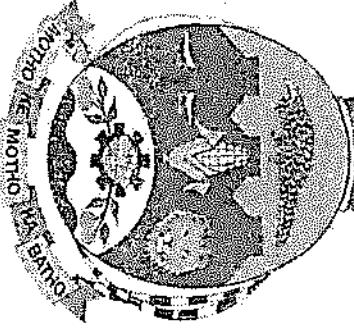

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this report is to inform the Mayor of the Mid-Year performance report for the period ended 31 December 2023 as required in terms of Section 72 of Municipal Finance Management Act.

2. BACKGROUND

To report to the Mayor on the Mid-Year Budget and Performance Assessment report 2023/2024 results as at the end of December 2023 of the 2023/2024 financial year as required by Sec 71, 52(d) and 72 of the Municipal Finance Management Act, 56 of 2003 and more detailed in the Municipal Budget and Reporting Regulations of 2009.

BACKGROUND CONTINUATION

Sec 71, 52(d) and 72 of the Municipal Finance Management Act, 56 of 2003, and in terms of section 28 of the Government Notice 3141 dated 17 April 2009, regarding the "Local Government: Municipal Budget and Reporting Regulations" necessitates that specific financial particulars be reported on and in the format prescribed, hence this report to meet legislative compliance.

"The mayor of a municipality

Must, within 30 days of the end of each quarter, submit a report to council on the implementation of the budget and financial state of the municipality." In compliance with sec 52(d) relating to the quarterly reporting period ended 31 December 2023.

Sec 72 of the Municipal Finance Management Act, 56 of 2003, states that: -

- (1) The accounting officer of a municipality must by 25 January of each year
 - (a) assess the performance of the municipality during the first half of the financial year, taking into account:-
 - (i) The monthly statements referred to in section 71 for the first half of the financial year.
 - (ii) The municipality's service delivery performance during the first half of the financial year, and the service delivery targets and performance indicators set in the service delivery and budget implementation plan.
 - (iii) The past year's annual report, and progress on resolving problems identified in the annual report and
 - (iv) The performance of every municipal entity under the sole or shared control of the municipality, taking into account reports in terms of section 88 from any such entities and
 - (b) submit a report on such assessment to.
 - (i) The mayor of the municipality
 - (ii) The national treasury and
 - (iii) The relevant provincial treasury.
- (2) The statement referred to in section 71(1) for the sixth month of a financial year may be incorporated into the report referred to in subsection (1)(b) of this section.
- (3) The accounting officer must, as part of the review.
 - a) Make recommendations as to whether an adjustments budget is necessary and
 - b) Recommend revised projections for revenue and expenditure to the extent that this may be necessary.

BACKGROUND CONTINUATION

This report is compiled to include the Mid-Year Performance Assessment of Lepelle-Nkumpi Municipality, furthermore, section 31 (1) of the Government Gazette No 32141 of 17 April 2009 prescribes the following:

Sec 31 (1) the mayor's quarterly report on the implementation of the budget and financial state of affairs of the municipality as required by section 52 (d) of the Act must be: -

(a) In the format specified in Schedule C and include all required tables, charts, and explanatory information, taking into account any guidelines issued by the Minister in terms of section 168 (1) of the Act; and

(b) Consistent with monthly budget statement for September, December, March and June as applicable and

In terms of Section 34 Municipal Reporting Regulations (MBRR); Publication of mid-year budget performance assessments –

(1) Within five working days of 25 January each year the municipal manager must make the mid-year budget and performance assessment public by placing it on the municipal website.

(2) The municipal manager must make public any other information that the municipal council considers appropriate to facilitate public awareness of the mid-year budget and performance assessment, including –

(a) Summaries in the alternate language predominant in the community, and
(b) Information relevant to each ward in the municipality.

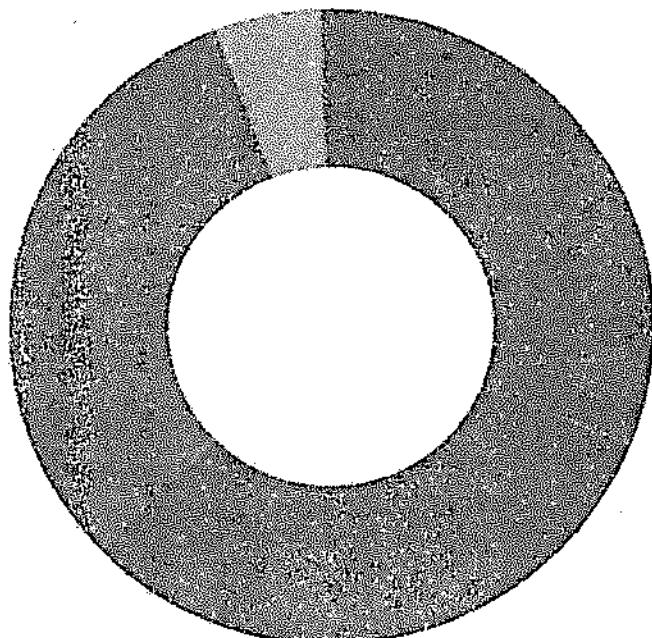

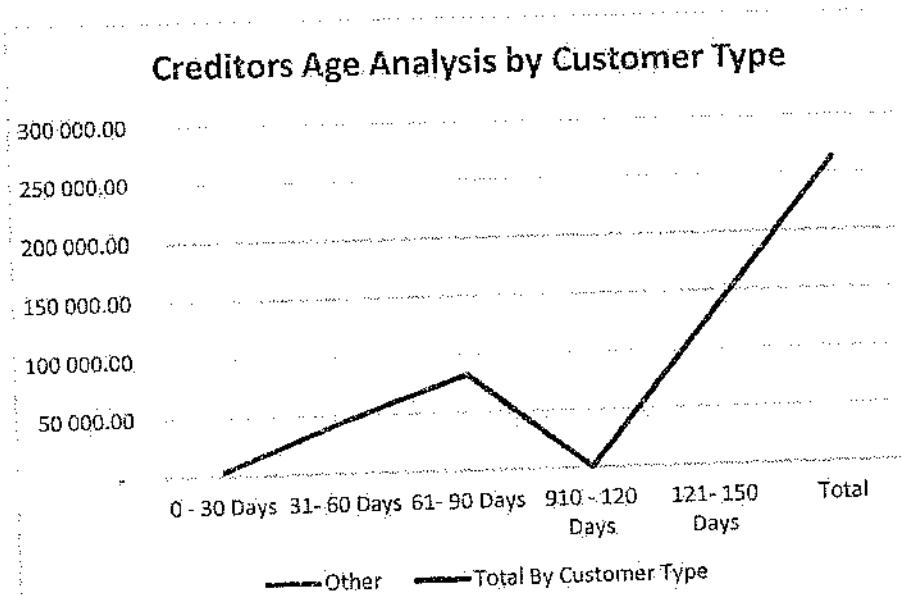

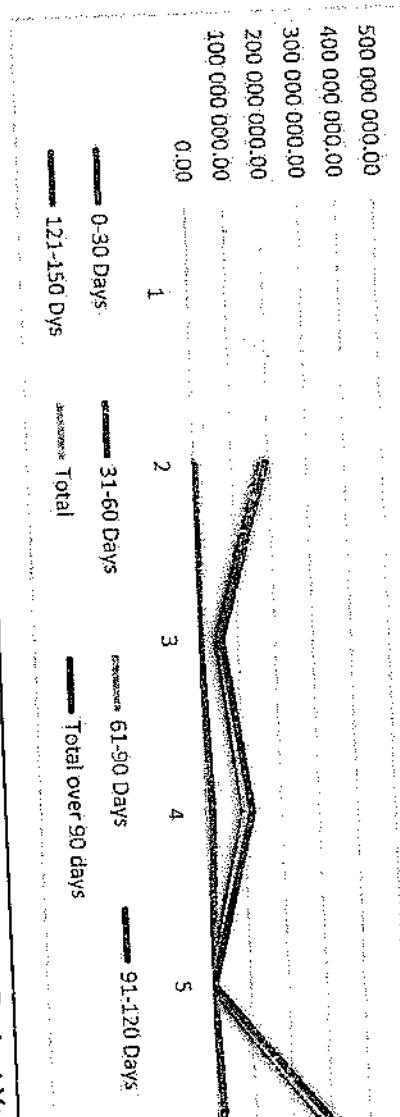

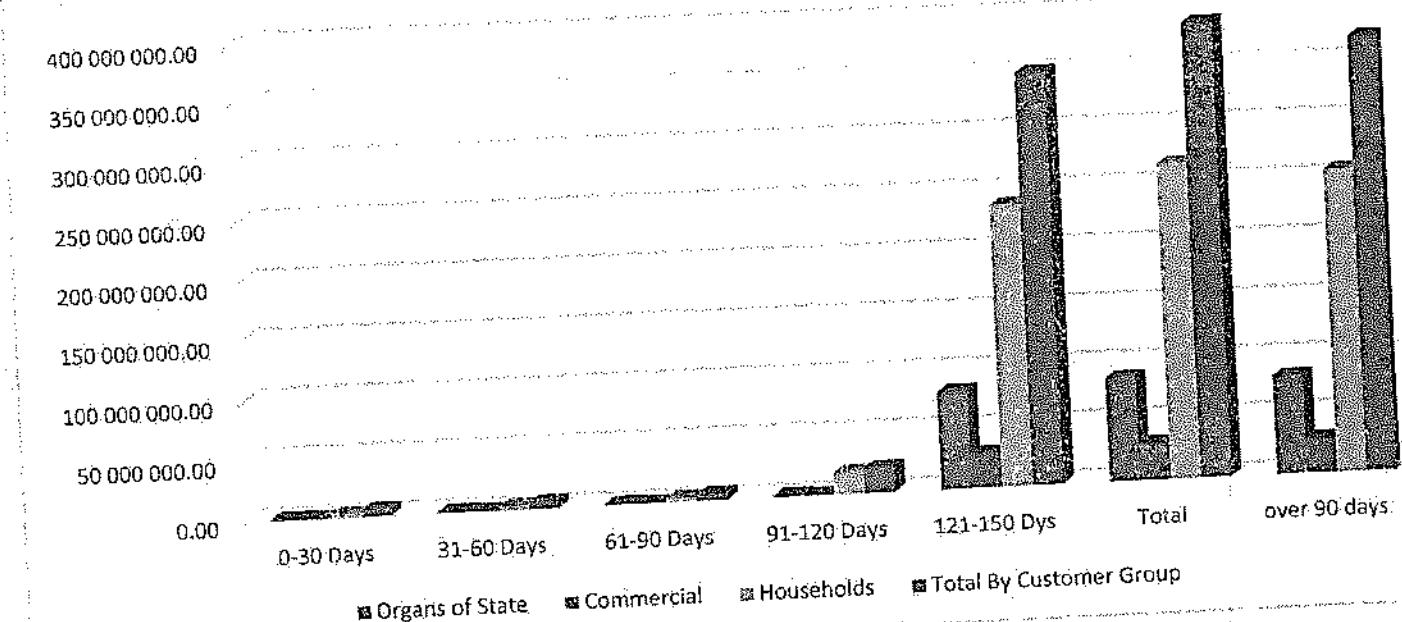

CONSUMER DEBTORS

Consumer debtors at the end of the sixth month is at R 387,929,981.00 million. The municipality's debtors are continually increasing which poses a serious threat to the municipality's future sustainability. A significant amount of debtors relates to household debtor's category which amounts to R 268,414,336.00 million, of which R257,973,729.00 million has been outstanding for more than 90 days.

Organ of state debtors are the second largest category of debtors owed to the municipality amounting to R88,097,711.00 million, of which R84,011,696.00 million of those debtors have been outstanding for more than 90 days. The lowest category of debtors owed to the municipality relates to Commercial which amounts to R31,417,934.00 million of which R29,405,880.00 million has been outstanding for more than 90 days.

PRIOR YEAR UNAUTHORISED EXPENDITURE

In accordance with Municipal Finance Management Act 56 of 2003, section 32(4). The Accounting officer must promptly inform the mayor, the MEC for local government in the province and the Auditor General, in writing, of:

- (a) any unauthorised, irregular or fruitless and wasteful expenditure incurred by the municipality
- (b) whether any person is responsible or under investigation for such unauthorised, irregular or fruitless and wasteful expenditure
- (c) the steps that have been taken
 - (i) to recover or rectify such expenditure and
 - (ii) to prevent a recurrence of such expenditure.

As part of the UFW reduction strategy the Municipality is required to reduce the unauthorised expenditure by 50% in 2023-2024 financial year and adhere to budgeting principles and proper planning as most of the unauthorised expenditure is due to projects that were not rolled over and under budgeting.

The municipality had a high balance of unauthorised expenditure. This has positioned the municipality as part of the ten (10) UIFW municipalities in the Province.

The unauthorised expenditure report from 2018-2019 to 2022-2023 financial year which was not investigated by Municipal Public Accounts Committee (MPAC) nor Financial Disciplinary Board

Most of the unauthorised expenditure is due to under budgeting of non-cash items such as Depreciation, Provision for bad debts, Fair value gain or (losses) etc.

It is against this background that the unauthorised expenditure be authorised through the correct processes as required in terms of section 32 and 28 of MFMA.

Chart C1 2023/24 Capital Expenditure Monthly Trend: actual v target

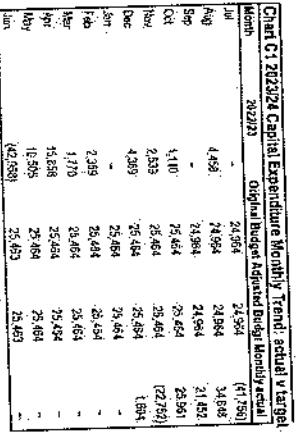


Chart C1 2023/24 Capital Expenditure Monthly Trend: actual v target

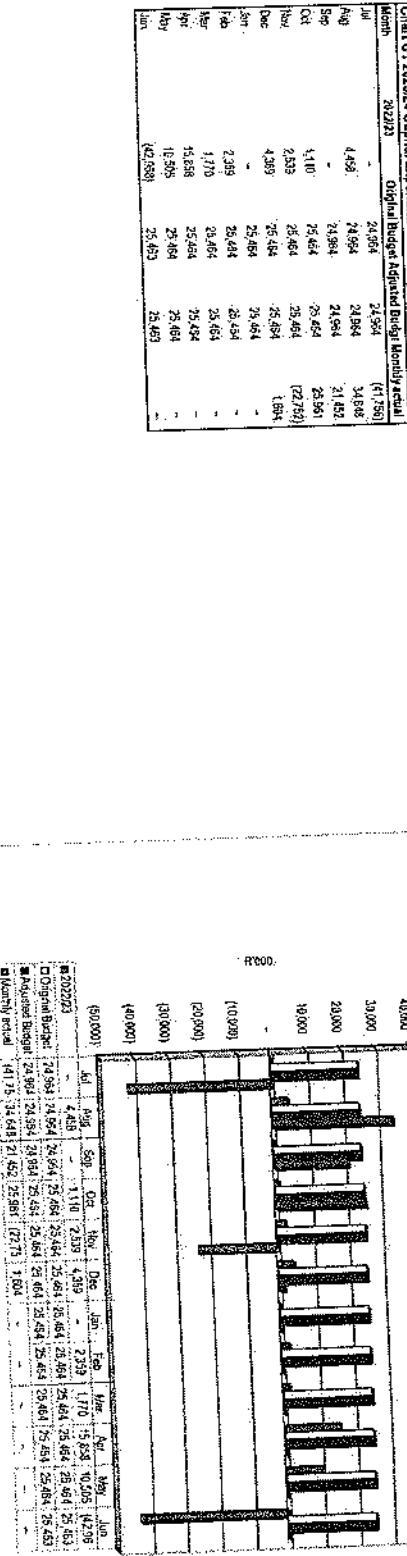


Chart C2 2023/24 Capital Expenditure: YTD actual v YTD target

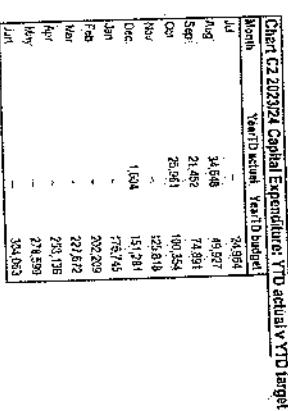
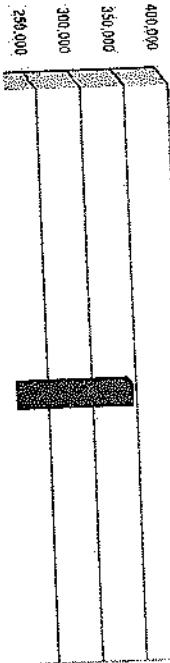


Chart C3 Aged Consumer Debtors Analysis

Chart C3 Aged Consumer Debtors Analysis



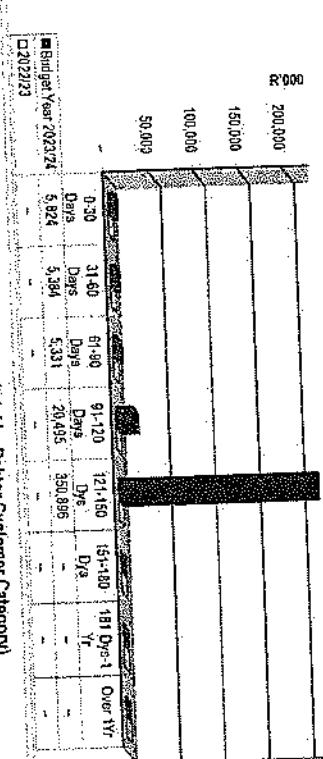


Chart C4 Consumer Debtors (Total by Debtor Customer Category)

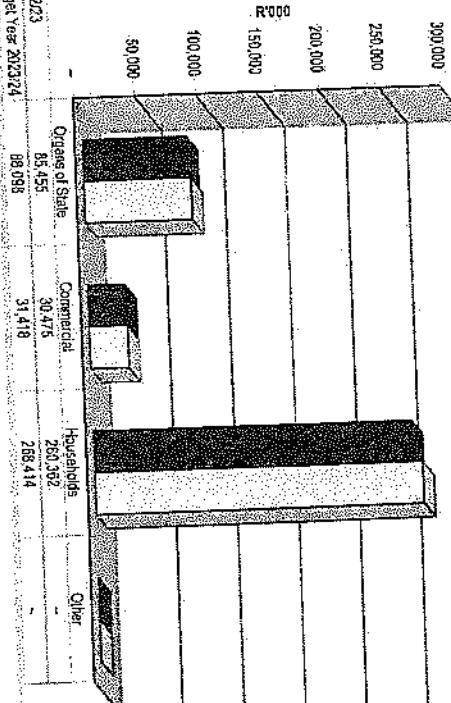


Chart C5 Aged Creditors Analysis

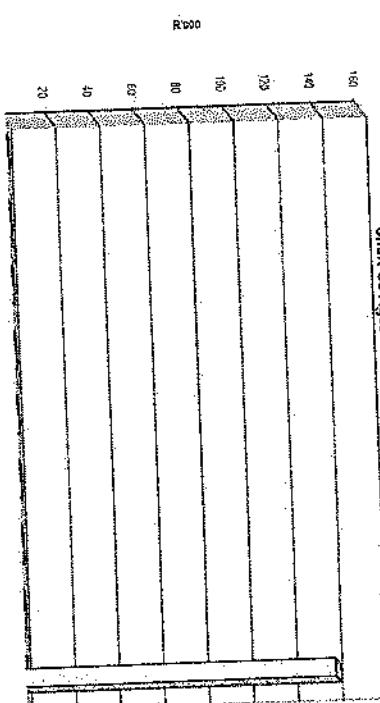

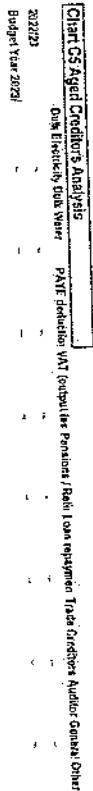


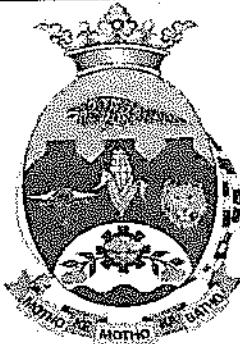
