LIBSA Business Day – 29 September 2005 Welcome by the Mayor of Lepelle Nkumpi Municipality

Those of us here today who know the processes of a municipality will know that as a municipality our actions are determined by the IDP processes since there is nothing that the municipality can do if it is not in its IDP document. The municipality has just started on its IDP review process for the 2006/07 financial year. I would therefore like to urge all business people to ensure that they acquaint themselves with the current IDP program to ensure that they can be able to input into it. Let us remember that the municipality is not just councillors or officials but includes even yourselves as members of the community. Therefore for our IDP document to truly be a document of the municipality you must have had an input into it. Please get involved.

All of us I am sure appreciate the immense possibilities that exist within the Lepelle Nkumpi Municipality and for us to be able to exploit them fully we need to work together. I am therefore very grateful to LIBSA for having organised this event as I am sure that it will go a long way in mobilising out business people and our community at large to the opportunities that exist. Let us realise that an opportunity is just an opportunity and will not make any difference until it is exploited. I hope today's proceedings will help us in coming up with ways of exploiting these opportunities. This is the very thing that leaves a lasting impression on our people. As the municipality and government as a whole we are faced with a huge challenge but I believe that together we can meet it.
